# CONSERVATION REPORT CARD



The Defenders of Wildlife Action Fund's *2005 Conservation Report Card* measures the commitment of U.S. Senators and Representatives to wildlife and habitat conservation during the first session of the 109th Congress. It reviews nine House votes and eight Senate votes on key conservation issues, providing a clear assessment of how well members of Congress are protecting wildlife and wild lands for future generations.

The *2005 Conservation Report Card* covers votes on issues including drilling in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge, reauthorizing the Endangered Species Act, maintaining protections for wildlife along America's borders and safeguarding our coastal waters from oil and gas exploration and drilling.

This report card is an important resource you can use to examine what your elected representatives are doing to conserve our natural heritage for our children and grandchildren. # SENATE Key Votes

## 1. Stopping a Budget Sneak Attack on the Arctic Refuge

By a razor-thin margin, the U.S. Senate supported a backdoor scheme to authorize drilling in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge through the federal budget process. The Senate defeated a refuge-protecting amendment to strike the drilling provision from the budget by a vote of 51 to 49.

## 2. Cutting Funding for Conservation and the Environment and Putting Arctic Refuge Drilling in the Budget

The Senate passed a 2006 budget resolution that significantly cuts funding for conservation and the environment and takes the first step toward authorizing drilling in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge through a backdoor budget process.

## 3. Anti-Environment Budget Bill

The Senate passed a final 2006 House-Senate compromise budget resolution that significantly cuts funding for conservation and the environment and includes a backdoor scheme that paves the way for drilling in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge.

## 4. Rejecting Requirement to Inventory Offshore Oil

The Senate rejected an amendment to the energy bill that would have protected our coastal waters off California, Florida and other states from damaging seismic oil and gas surveys.

## 5. Halting Subsidies for Destructive Logging Roads

The Senate defeated an amendment that would have stopped the construction of damaging logging roads in Alaska's pristine Tongass National Forest at taxpayer expense.

## 6. Short-Sighted Energy Policy

The Senate passed an energy bill that fails to reduce America's dependence on oil, fails to address the threat of global warming, fails to make any new investments in clean energy and, by President Bush's own admission, fails to help consumers at the gas pump. Most devastating to wildlife, the bill includes a provision to conduct seismic oil and gas surveys along our nation's coastline.

## 7. Flawed Budget Bill

The Senate passed a federal budget reconciliation bill that includes language to drill in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge.

## 8. Anti-Arctic Refuge Military Bill

The Senate rejected attempts to add an Arctic National Wildlife Refuge drilling provision to the Department of Defense spending bill.

# HOUSE Key Votes

## 1. Maintaining Wildlife Habitat Protection Along America's Borders

The House defeated an amendment to the Real ID Act of 2005 that would have stripped language allowing the secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to waive all U.S. law, including environmental law, when constructing walls, fences, roads and other barriers along the U.S. borders with Canada and Mexico. The defeated amendment also would have eliminated language making the secretary unaccountable to any court in the land, including the U.S. Supreme Court.

## 2. Cutting Funding for Conservation and the Environment

The House passed a 2006 budget resolution that significantly cuts funding for conservation and the environment.

## 3. Halting Arctic Refuge Drilling in the Energy Bill

The House rejected an amendment to protect the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge from oil drilling.

## 4. Anti-Environment Budget Bill

The House passed a final House-Senate compromise budget resolution that includes backdoor schemes that significantly cut funding for conservation and pave the way for drilling in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge.

## 5. Short-Sighted Energy Policy

The House passed an energy bill that fails to reduce America's dependence on oil, fails to address the threat of global warming, fails to make any new investments in clean energy and, by President Bush's own admission, fails to help consumers at the gas pump. Particularly devastating to wildlife, the bill includes a provision to conduct seismic oil and gas surveys along our nation's coastlines.

## 6. Alternative Endangered Species Act Reauthorization

The House failed to pass an alternative, bipartisan substitute offered to the reckless Threatened and Endangered Species Recovery Act (H.R. 3824), a bill that would significantly weaken the Endangered Species Act.

## 7. Pombo Wildlife Extinction Bill

The House passed a bill that guts the landmark 1973 Endangered Species Act.

## 8. "No Relief" Energy Act

The House passed supplemental energy legislation that harms wildlife, public lands and public health instead of offering solutions to consumers and businesses hard hit by rising gasoline prices and soaring winter heating costs.

## 9. Anti-Arctic Refuge Military Bill

The House voted to approve a rule that allowed the inclusion of language in the Department of Defense appropriations bill that would legalize drilling in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge.
